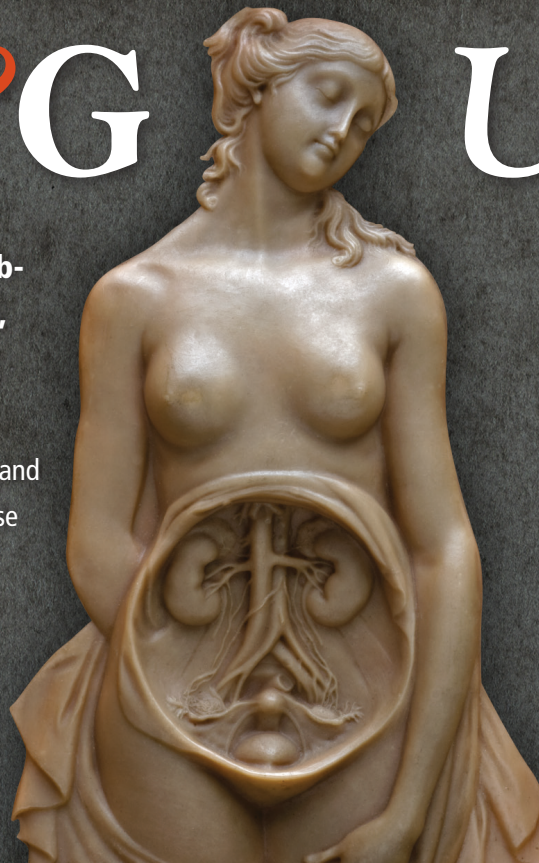

FGM/C is a cultural practice that affects more than 100 million worldwide. Questions about whether a woman has had FGM/C need to be asked with extreme cultural sensitivity. There is an increased likelihood of urinary tract infections and obstetric complications. It is illegal in most states of Australia.
